Educational Psychology Syllabus (教育心理學)

Course Description

The Educational Psychology course explains the cognitive, linguistic, personal, social, and moral development of individuals as well as individual and group differences. This lesson also describes behaviorist and social cognitive views of learning, intrinsic and extrinsic motivation, and informal and formal assessments.

The mission of the Educational Psychology course is to provide instructors with the information needed to focus on the core principles of learning, use these principles to understand the learning and behavior of students, and consistently apply these principles to classroom practice.

With a focus on K-12 learners, Educational Psychology explains cognitive and linguistic development; personal, social, and moral development; individual and group differences; behaviorist views of learning; social cognitive views of learning; motivation; instructional strategies; classroom management; and assessment.
